Curriculum

Math

In math, we will continue learning about the concept of subtraction. We will be using many manipulatives and doing many hands on activities in order for students to understand that subtracting means taking away or removing things from a group. This week we will continue working on building fluency of 5partners with subtraction. We will also be learning how to show and explain our thinking for subtraction word problems (story problems).

Science

In science, students are continuing to learn about the different types of weather. We will be observing the weather and keeping a daily log in the classroom. Students will begin conducting experiments to learn about

how weather tools work.
This will be our final week
finishing up our weather unit
and moving on to our Animals
2 by 2 unit.

Reading

The focus for the next two weeks is for readers to use all of their "tricks and tools" to decode unknown words. We would like for parents to encourage their children to use letter sounds, parts or chunks of words, picture clues, and what word would make sense instead of just supplying the word when a child is stumped. We are really trying to foster some reading independence and problem solving abilities for your child.

Writing

Students are continuing to learn how to write "All About Books." These books allow

students to write many details on topics they already know lots about.

Social Studies

We will be spending one more week to finish up our unit on maps. Then we will be starting a unit called, "We are Alike. We are Different." Students will be comparing and contrasting differences in cultures and people.

It's already time to sign up for elective/language courses next school year! Elective Registration forms come home today, Monday, April 7th in your child's Monday folder. Please complete the forms and

return them to your child's homeroom teacher no later than Friday, April 11th. You will notice the forms look slightly different this year. Courses are grouped by strand. When making your choices, you must select your priority ranking by quarter (i.e., Q1, Q2, Q3, Q4). However, this will require you to look at
